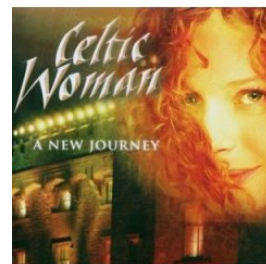

believe the Mother Church was substituted for mother goddess and custom began to dictate that a person visit the church of his/her baptism on this day. People attended the mother church of their parish, laden with offerings.

In England in the 1600's, young men and women who were apprentices or servants returned home on Mothering Sunday, would bring small gifts like trinkets or a "mothering cake" to their mothers. Sometimes frumenty was served, which is wheat grains boiled in sweet milk, sugared and spiced.

In northern England and in Scotland, the preferred food was carlings - pancakes made of steeped Pease fried in butter, with pepper and salt.

Another kind of mothering cakes was the simnel cake, a very rich fruit cake. It is boiled in water, then baked, and often finished with a marzipan.
